\$5.5 Billion of facility improvements and new construction contracts will be awarded through FY 2012-13. Eighty percents of the contracts are design-built, with a strong small business participation goal of 40%, especially for projects under \$7 million. The speaker will detail the projects in Southern California, the contracting amounts and status and website links for business opportunities with the navy.
