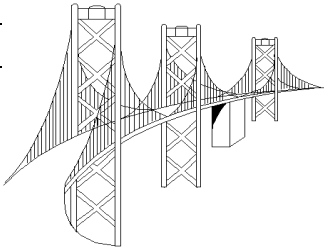

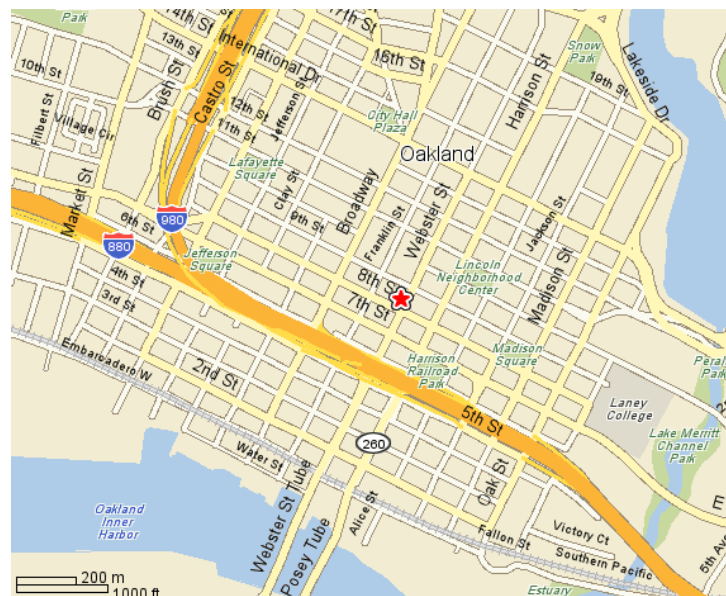
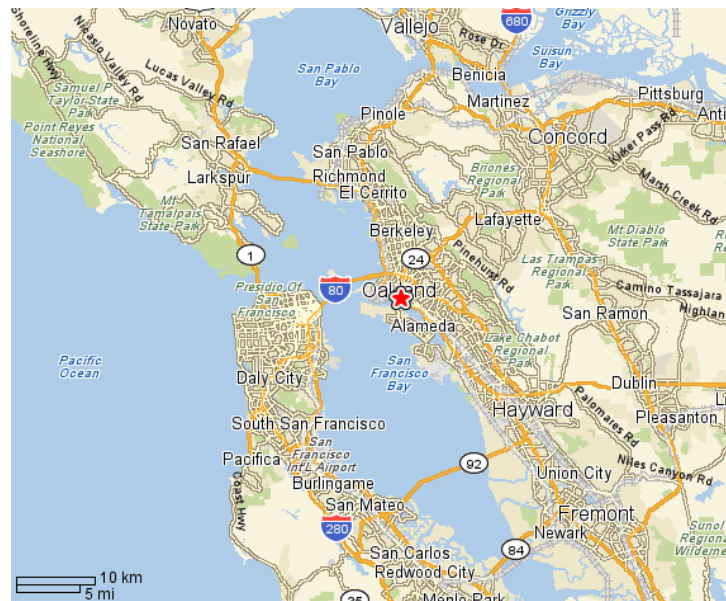
From BART: From the Oakland City Center 12th St. Station, proceed south on Broadway, turn left on 9th Street and right on Webster.

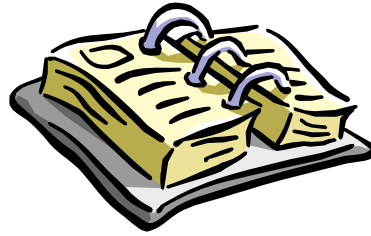
